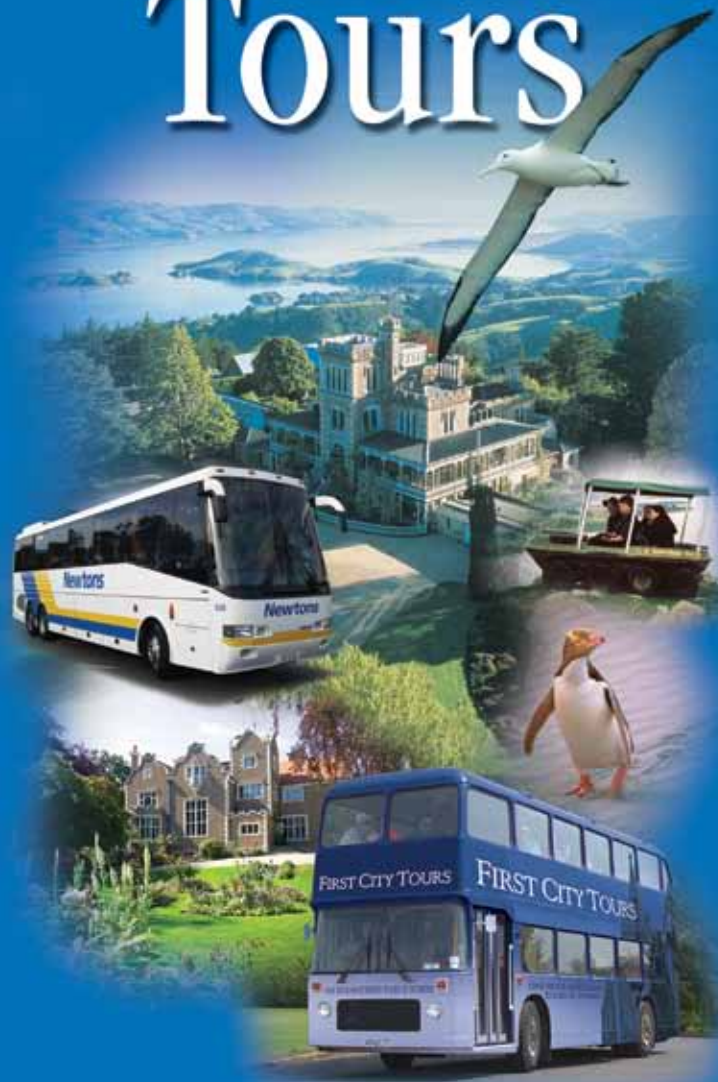


Newtons Dunedin Tours



Tour 1: DOUBLE DECK BUS TOUR

Your Dunedin experience begins with this full commentary tour of the life and times in this 'city of firsts'. Scottish settlers arrived here in 1848 and the incorporation of the City Council in 1865 was the first in New Zealand. Dunedin also is home to NZ's first university, first girl's high school, first chocolate factory, first public botanic gardens, first daily newspaper, first cable car public transport, first gas street lighting and first public art gallery. The first telephone call in New Zealand was made here and we also visit the world's steepest street, Baldwin St. We take photo stops at Unity park city lookout, Baldwin Street, the University and the historic railway station and courthouse precinct.

Tour 2: DOUBLE DECK BUS TOUR PLUS OLVESTON STATELY HOME

As an optional inclusion, you are highly recommended to visit Olveston stately home. Disembarking from the double deck bus at its halfway point, you can take a one hour guided tour before re-boarding the coach on its next circuit to complete your heritage tour of Dunedin. The Olveston tour is an intimate experience of the life of an affluent Dunedin family in the early years of the 20th century. In 1904 David Theomin, one of Dunedin's most prosperous businessmen, commissioned his stately home and filled it with magnificent collections gathered from around the world. Since the death of his daughter, Dorothy, in 1966, the home has been faithfully preserved under a trust deed. The experience is authentic from the kitchen utensils used by the servants to the family Fiat in the garage.

Tour 3: WILDLIFE TOUR

Settle back and enjoy the spectacular drive over the High Road offering panoramic views down Otago Harbour on one side and over the Pacific Ocean on the other as you drive alongside quaint stone-walled farmlets.

Larnach's Castle – Halfway down the peninsula we call into the grounds of Larnach's castle for a photo opportunity in the beautifully laid out gardens of this imposing 19th century home.

Wildlife – On arrival at the head-land you have a choice of a guided tour through one of the following three wildlife colonies:

3a: Albatross Colony

The royal albatross centre is sited at Taiaroa head and this tour option includes:

- An audio-visual presentation on the life of the albatross
- A guided visit to the nest site observatory. (open November 24 – September 16th)

3b: Natures Wonders Penguin Tour

All aboard the exciting 8wd Argo all terrain vehicle and over the Reid family farm down to Penguin Beach. On the beach front you will visit viewing hides for colonies of yellow-eyed penguins, little blue penguins, NZ fur seals, and cormorants, all living in harmony in their natural environment. The viewing hides are strategically located to balance your viewing experience with privacy for the wildlife to ensure that you see them going about their normal daily lives.

3c: Penguin Place

At this yellow-eyed penguin reserve on the McGrouther family farm, wooden hutches have been placed around their beach frontage and tunnels constructed to allow visitors to move around for ground level photo opportunities. The tour begins with a talk on the life of the yellow eyed penguin.

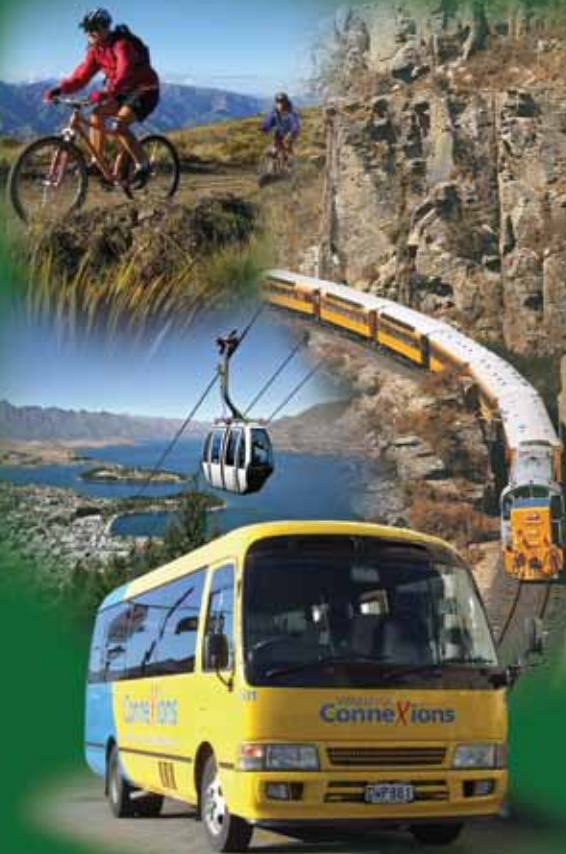

Track & Trail

"Track & Trail" tours provide a variety of coach connections with the famous heritage train trip through the Taieri Gorge. The Taieri Gorge rail line is a magnificent engineering feat which was constructed in harsh conditions during the latter part of the 19th century by hardy pioneers with pick, shovel and dynamite. The journey takes you through the real southern outback, inaccessible by public road, over spectacular viaducts spanning the Taieri River and through tunnels carved through the hillsides to Pukerangi, the hill of heaven.

Track & Trail Connexion with Queenstown & Wanaka

Experience the Taieri Gorge train trip, a coach journey through the rail trail and continue by coach from Cromwell to either Queenstown or Wanaka. Tour operates either way.
